The summary section of the document clearly says: "The Board considers that applicants who have been taught and assessed in English in their tertiary, entry to practice nursing and/or midwifery education in the countries listed here should meet this requirement. The countries are: - Australia (etc)... " This is in total contradiction to point 4 which says: An IELTS (or approved equivalent) Test Report Form older than two years may be accepted as current if accompanied by proof that an applicant: a) has maintained employment in the workplace as a nurse and/or midwife using English as the primary language of practice in a country where English is the native or first language or b) is a registered student who was required to provided an IELTS of 7 or equivalent at the commencement of his or her program of study and who has successfully completed the program of study in a full-time or part-time capacity in English, in a period that is greater than two (2) years. So one part is saying if they completed their degree in English (in Australia) they do not need to re-test and demonstrate an IELTS of 7 while the other part is saying this is only true if they enter with an IELTS of 7 to start with. Clarification on this is required. Similarly, the new document makes no reference to the backdating to June 2010 - so is this still in effect or has sense prevailed and students currently enrolled are exempt (with incoming students from 2011 required to meet the standards (once standards are clarified).
