

Communiqué

Meeting of the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia 25 September 2014 at the Parmelia Hilton, Perth

The Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (the National Board or NMBA) is the national regulator for nursing and midwifery in Australia. It is established under the Health Practitioner Regulation National Law, as in force in each state and territory (the National Law).

The National Board meets monthly and considers a range of matters, the most important of which are published in this Communiqué.

In order to facilitate engagement with local stakeholders across states and territories, the National Board now holds its monthly meeting in a different state and territory every two to three months.

This helps the National Board to gain a better understanding of the jurisdictional matters relating to the regulation of enrolled nurses, registered nurses, midwives and students.

It also supports information sharing on the National Board's strategic priorities, projects and regulatory functions with local representatives from the professional and industrial organisations, education providers and employers, health department and members of the local state or territory board of the NMBA.

Review of the National Registration and Accreditation Scheme for health professionals

The independent review of the National Scheme is underway and the NMBA joined with the other National Boards and AHPRA in providing a submission to the consultation paper.

The terms of reference for the review and the consultation paper are published at <u>Australian Health</u> <u>Ministers' Advisory Council website</u> under 'media releases' on the right-hand tab. The review – led by independent reviewer, Mr Kim Snowball – was built into the intergovernmental agreement that set up the framework and governance arrangements for the National Scheme. The agreement stated that the Australian Health Workforce Ministerial Council (Ministerial Council) would initiate an independent review after three years of the National Scheme's operation.

Stakeholder Forum WA

The National Board held a stakeholder forum on 24 September 2014 in Perth. Participants included nursing and midwifery professional associations and education providers.

The purpose of the forum was to enable:

- the National Board to outline its strategic directions and work of National committees for policy, accreditation, finance and governance, and
- local stakeholders to ask questions and discuss the National Board's role and work in regulating nurses, midwives and students.

In addition to a question and answer session, topics covered included:

• National Registration and Accreditation Scheme (National Scheme)

- Functions of the National Board
- Functions of AHPRA
- NMBA strategic plan 2013-2015
- State and territory boards of the NMBA, and
- National Committees of the National Board i.e. Finance and Governance Committee, Policy Committee and the Accreditation Committee.

As well as National Board members presenting, WA AHPRA representatives were in attendance to address operational matters arising.

Participant feedback was overall good and confirmed that the forum provided networking opportunities, with good participation and interaction.

Thought post review/Board performance review

As a part of effective governance the NMBA undertakes a review of its performance in relation to the regulation of nurses and midwives in Australia. The NMBA values the opportunity to reflect on its performance and has recently completed this review and have identified opportunities for further improvement for the next 12 months.
