Hi,

I think the draft looks good. I agree with the criteria that have been removed. I prefer OPTION 2- for changes to be made.

As for your questions- I do not think midwives should have to be working across the full scope of midwifery practice in order to be eligible for endorsement. I think midwives should be able to be endorsed and only provide antenatal and postnatal services, for example. I am not sure how I feel about having a specific notation on her registration stating this. I personally think that it is up to the midwife to practice within her scope of experience and practice and that this doesn't need to be stated- simply because this status may change. She may deliver antenatal care for 1 year and then move on to doing postnatal care another year. Having a notation on the registration may imply that the midwife is incapable of delivering that aspect of care, which I do not believe is true; it simply means she may need to update herself before doing it again.

Additionally, I do not work in private practice yet have completed the prescribing course at Griffith. I would like to see an addit to the draft allowing midwives to prescribe and order pathology within the hospital setting (obviously with hospital approval), as do nurse practitioners.
